

# The Historical Society has carried out our mission of preservation and education through the Great Depression, too many wars, numerous presidents, several terrorist attacks, the Great Recession and two pandemics

Dear Members,

It often takes hindsight to recognize the significance of an event but 2020 left no doubt that all of us were experiencing history as it was happening. This year demanded flexibility, patience and hope from all of us as our lives came to a standstill. Like many small organizations, our priority was to keep our staff and buildings safe while preparing for lost income from rentals, fundraisers and membership.

Accepting our changed circumstances, we revised our budget to eliminate expenses wherever possible. Thanks to our proactive planning over the past years, the 10 buildings and landmarks we preserve are well-maintained. We were able to defer those projects that could wait but carried on with regular maintenance. When the Sutton Clock suffered unexpected damage, we were able to act with the help of the community. We applied for and received a PPP Loan that helped us cover payroll and ensure that staff was on hand to continue necessary work. We were able to cover some lost revenue by filing an insurance claim for business interruption due to the pandemic. All these actions enabled us to bridge the gap during this challenging year.

Recognizing the historic time we were living through, we reached out to the community for contributions of art, photos, and journals that would tell the story of our experience to future generations. We increased our *Bedford Stories*, social media and membership outreach to bring history to life during this unprecedented year. With our educational programs and events on hold, we dedicated ourselves to the long list of deferred tasks that any small organization has. We cleared out inboxes and old files, redesigned our website, and tackled the inventory of our collections archive in four storage areas and the museum.

Over the summer, we were able to open the Court House Museum to visitors by appointment. The School of Rock Bedford made Historical Hall its second rehearsal area creating a win-win situation for the community. Kimberly House, our new tenant, moved into The Bedford Store in September as businesses began to reopen bringing Bedford back to life. On October 1st we had our first hybrid event at Historical Hall with William Abranowicz presenting his book of photographs inspired by the Voting Rights Movement.

While it was a year of real challenge for all of us, your continued support was an affirmation that this community continues to value its history. Thanks to our members, the tradition of preservation that makes Bedford special remains strong. You really do make everything we do possible.

While he contributed his time and talents to many of our initiatives, it was his leadership in the Burning of Bedford Commemoration that earned him the Greater Hudson Heritage Network's "Excellence Award" in 2020. ### LEARNING DOESN'T JUST HAPPEN IN THE CLASSROOM

To adequately share Bedford's history, we keep one foot in the past and the other in the present. The Society gathers and researches history as it is occurring to better understand what we don't yet know. At the onset of the pandemic, we asked the community to document their experiences with photos, artwork, letters and diaries. Thanks to those who sent their stories and mementos, we can record history as it happens and share it with the community.

In 2020 as the nation began to again focus on social justice reform, we turned our attention to finding and filling the gaps in Bedford's unwritten black history. With the help of our valued intern, Henry Pence, we have begun this work to learn what we can about the African Americans who lived here. In 2021 we are collaborating with the Town's IDEA committee to expand our knowledge on the experiences of all minority groups. ### A PHOTOGRAPHIC HISTORY INSPIRED BY THE VOTING RIGHTS MOVEMENT WITH ACCLAIMED PHOTOGRAPHER WILLIAM ABRANOWICZ







On Thursday, October 1st a "capacity crowd" joined us for an intimate, socially distant evening with William Abranowicz as he shared photographs, stories and the history of the Voting Rights Movement from his new book *This Far and No Further*. The talk was also live streamed and taped for the community.

Executive Director Lynn Ryan opened the evening with an update on how the Society was coping with lost income due to the pandemic and "our efforts to continue preservation of the 10 buildings we own and/or maintain." There was a live auction of a print donated by Bill Abranowicz from his new book and two planks handcrafted by Rich Carpino from a Bedford Oak limb drop.

We are so fortunate to have a community that is so supportive, especially when we are all struggling to try and figure out how to survive the new "normal."

### - Properties -

It's been said that good luck is the result of good planning! We were fortunate that our Properties Committee has prepared well and no major projects were necessary this year. While income was substantially decreased, we painted the exterior of The Bedford Store as planned, continued maintenance on the 10 landmarks and properties we preserve and handled the unexpected repairs on the Sutton Clock with the help of our community.





Rich Carpino, our Properties Manager, fabricated and installed a custom built board and batten door for the rear entrance of the Court House where we also cleared and replaced damaged leaders and drains for the Town.

In early October while one of Clock Winders was performing the weekly wind, the click didn't properly engage and in seconds seven teeth on the cast iron ratchet wheel were sheered off and fell to the floor, the handle spun out of control and the steel cable snapped sending the weight box filled with rocks plunging three stories to the floor. The Clock Winder avoided injury, but our beloved clock was not as lucky. After reviewing multiple bids, we selected Essence of Time in Lockport, NY to handle the extensive repairs. The clock is like new and should continue to chime for another 100 years.

If you know the story of the Clock and Tower, you'll know history repeated itself when, once again, our generous community stepped up and donated the funds necessary to repair the damaged works. A video of the repairs is on our website along with a *Bedford Story* about the Suttons and their clock. We are deeply grateful to all who donated, to head Clock Winder Vincent Morrow, former head Clock Winder Ben Branch, Property Manager Rich Carpino and all in the Clock Winder community who keep the clock in good working order!


